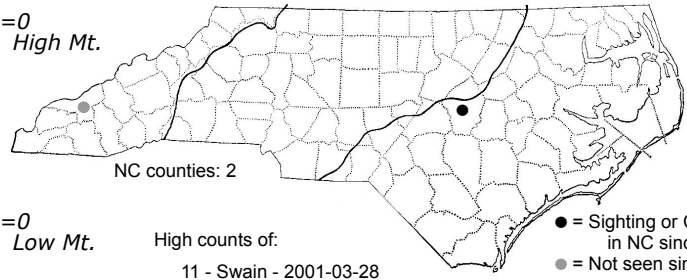


Grammonota inornata a dwarf spider

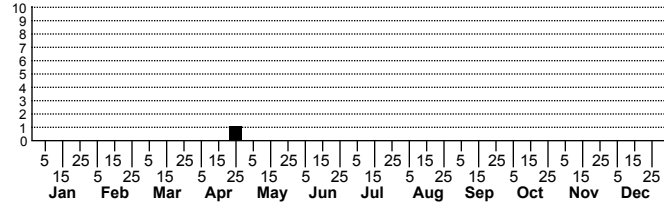

ORDER:ARANEAE INFRAORDER:Araneomorphae
FAMILY:Linyphiidae SUBFAMILY:Erigoninae

FLD_GUIDE_DESCRIPTIONS: "The prosoma is dark brown. The opisthosoma is dark gray. The legs are orange, with dusky bands at the distal ends of the femurs and tibiae." (Rose, 2022) Unlike many linyphiid species, the head of male is little different from that of the female.

DISTRIBUTION_COMMENTS: Eastern US and Canada, west to the Great Plains, and south to Texas.

HABITAT: Kaston (1948) reported this species being found under leaves, but also "in greatest abundance [in Connecticut] on open beaches under dry eel-grass and other weeds."
