


## Leucobryum albidum (Brid. ex P.Beauv.) Lindb. pincushion moss



PHYLUM: Mosses ORDER: Dicranales FAMILY: Leucobryaceae

## TAXONOMIC\_COMMENTS:

SPECIES\_DESCRIPTION: <b>Plants</b> 6-9 mm high and tightly compacted in rounded, sometimes lobed, grayish green <b> cushions</b> 1-10 cm in diameter, occasionally wider, becoming light yellow-green when wet; <b>stems</b>, largely hidden by branching through the thickness of the cushion that builds over and around them; leaves consisting of blade and sheath; blades 3-8 mm long narrowing upward from the top of the sheath to a tip with somewhat incurved margins; <b>sheath</b> 1-3 mm partially clasping the stem from its insertion on the stem and extending upward to the base of the blade.

MICROSCOPE\_VIEW: <b>Microscope View:</b> Cutting a cross section through the sheath base just above its attachment with the stem reveals 2-3 air/water-holding leucocyte cell layers above and below a single layer of tiny, green photosynthetic chlorocyte cells.

ABUNDANCE: Common

DISTRIBUTION: Likely occurring in every county in North Carolina

HABITAT: Wide variety of moist, swamps, bogs, floodplains, and mesic woods, to dry sandy, xeric woodland soil substrates as well as tree bases, including pine found in particularly moist areas; becoming uncommon with altitudes in excess of 4000 ft (1200 m).
