




Cucullia alfarata Camphorweed Owlet Moth

FOOD: Reported hosts include aster (<i>Symphyotrichum</i>), golden-aster (<i>Chrysopsis</i> and <i>Heterotheca</i>), and horseweed (<i>Erigeron</i>) (Wagner, 2005; BugGuide). In North Carolina, larvae have been observed on silkgrass (<i>Pityopsis</i> sp.), Maryland Golden-aster (<i>Chrysopsis mariana</i>), and Bushy Aster (<i>Symphyotrichum dumosum</i>).
