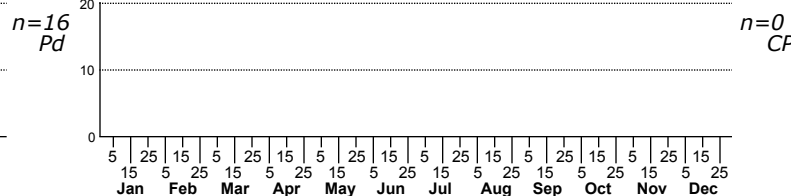
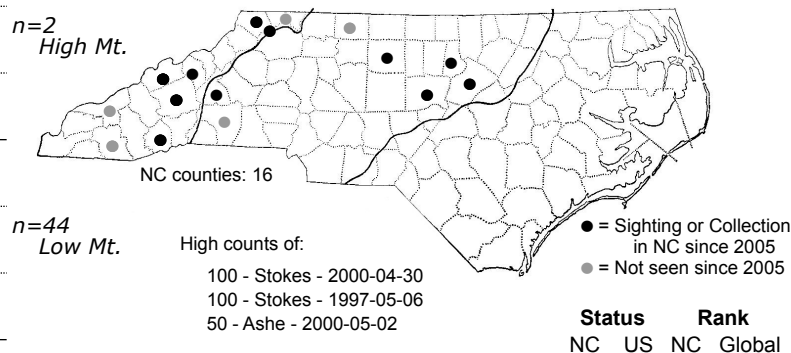
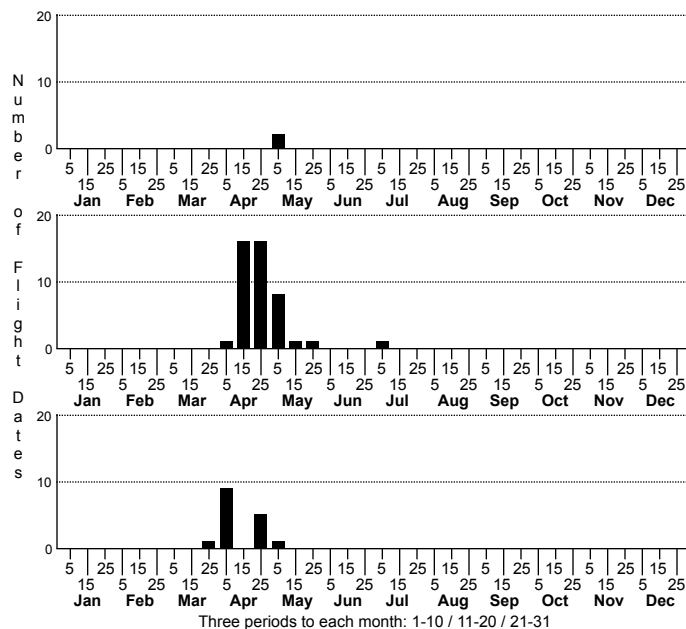


Morrisonia evicta Bicolored Woodgrain

HABITAT: Habitats include forests and woodlands (Wagner et al., 2012). Our records come from bottomland and mesic and dry-xeric upland forests.

FOOD: Larvae feed on a wide range of shrub species, representing a number of different families. Wagner et al. (2011) specifically list chokeberry (*Aronia*), hazel (*Corylus*), laurel (*Kalmia*), American Hop-hornbeam (*Ostrya virginiana*), cherry (*Prunus*), blueberry (*Vaccinium*), and *Viburnum*.
