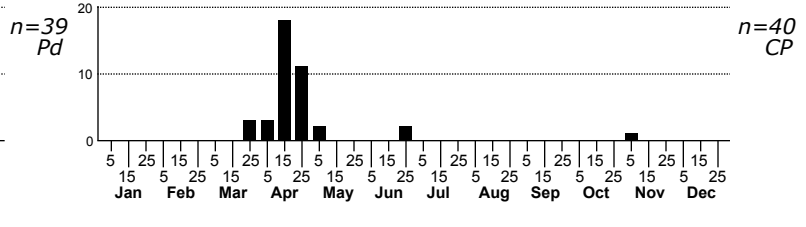
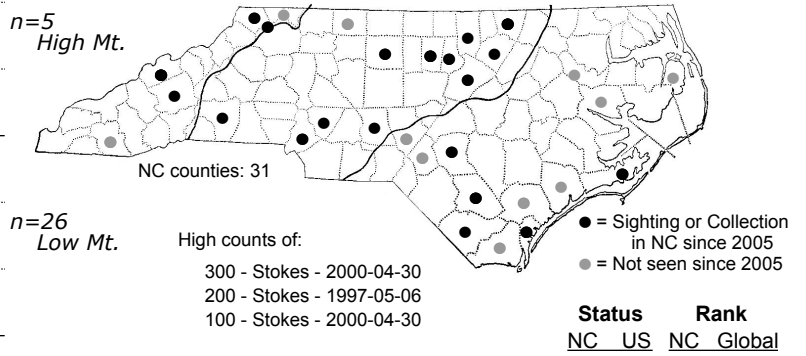
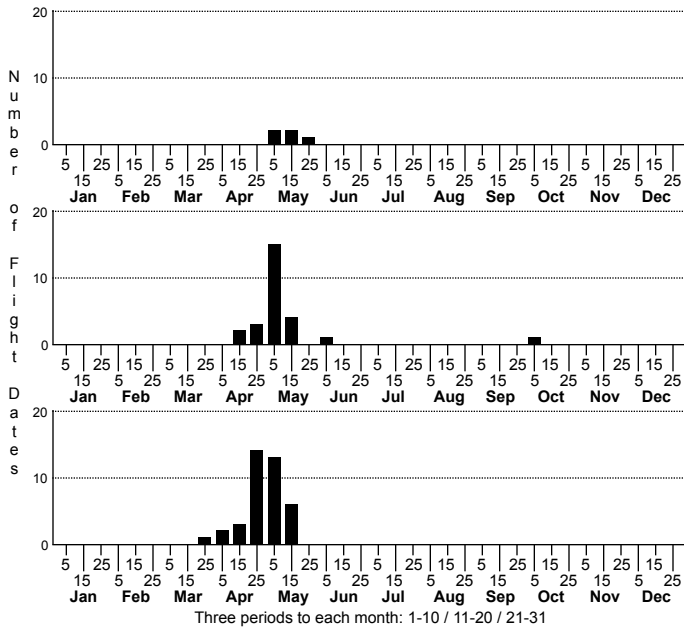


*Ulolonche culea* Sheathed Quaker
