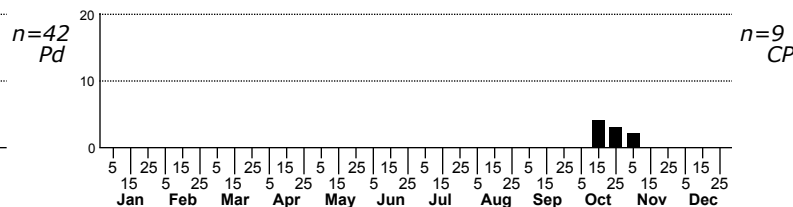
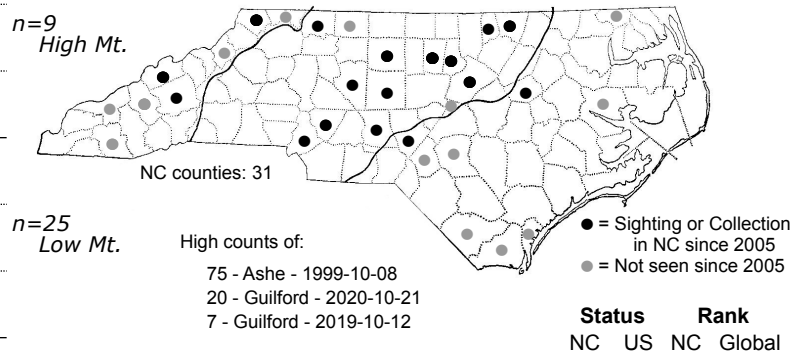
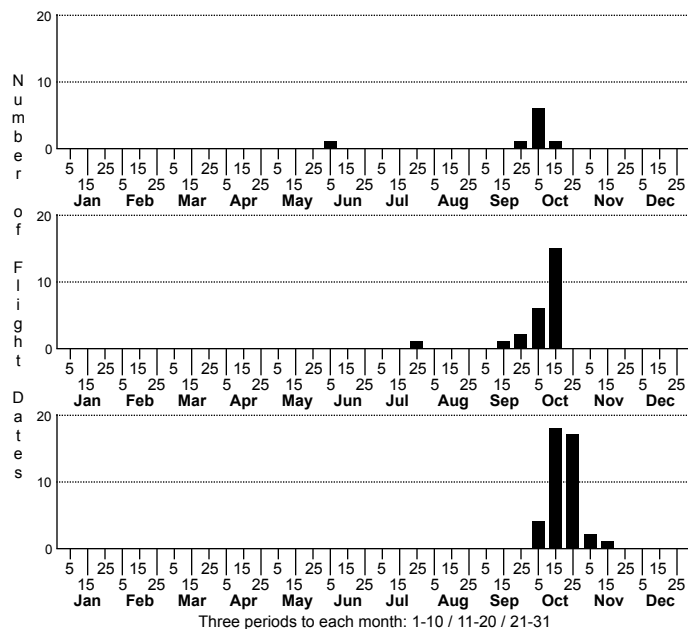


Agrotis gladiaria Swordsman Dart



FAMILY: Noctuidae SUBFAMILY: Noctuinae TRIBE: Noctuini

TAXONOMIC COMMENTS: One of twenty-three species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010), seven of which have been recorded in North Carolina

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on a range of grasses and low plants, including many of agricultural importance. Lafontaine (2004) lists alfalfa, aster, barley, blackberry, bluegrass, bluestem, cabbage, clover, corn, goldenrod, oats, onion, sweet potato, tobacco, and tomato. The hosts utilized by this species in North Carolina have not been documented.

NATURAL HERITAGE PROGRAM RANKS: G5 SNR [S4S5]

STATE PROTECTION: Has no legal protection, although permits are required to collect it on state parks and other public lands.
