
## Euxoa immixta Mixed Dart



FAMILY: Noctuidae SUBFAMILY: Noctuinae TRIBE: Noctuini
TAXONOMIC\_COMMENTS: One of 181 species that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010).
Most are Western but 13 have been recorded in North Carolina. Euxoa inmixta belongs to the Silens Group of Subgenus Euxoa (Lafontaine, 1987).
