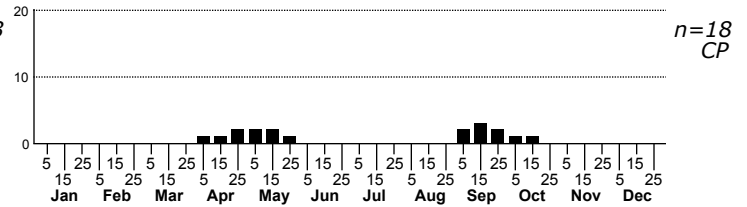
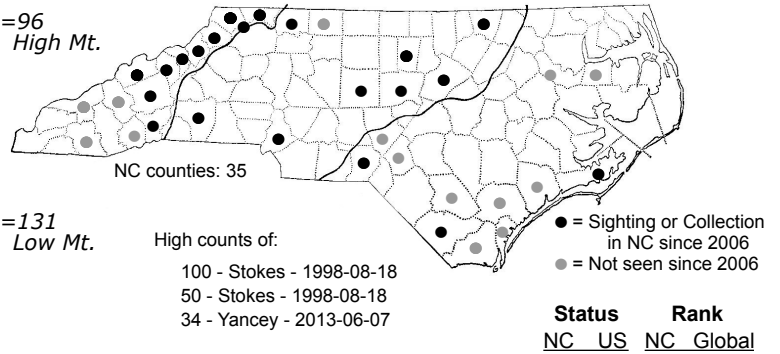
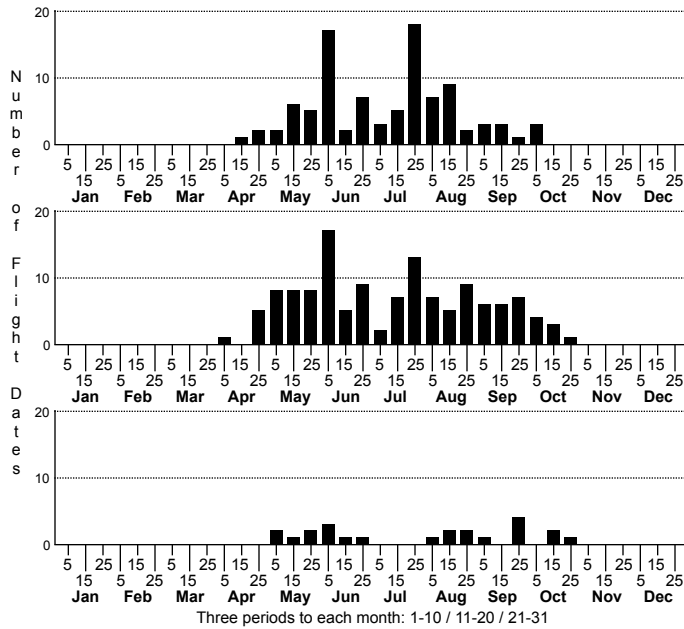


Xestia dolosa Greater Black-letter Dart

HABITAT: Fields, barrens, woodlands, forests, and other closed and open habitats (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, records come primarily from mesic forests in the Mountains and from a wider set of barrens and forests in the eastern part of the state.

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on a wide range of forbs, grasses, and low-growing woody plants (Wagner et al., 2011); records also exist from apple (<i>Malus</i>), currant (<i>Ribes</i>), and pear (<i>Pyrus</i>).
