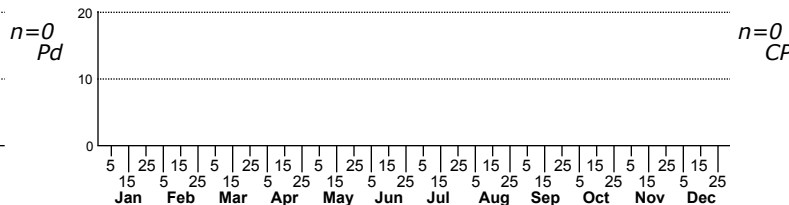
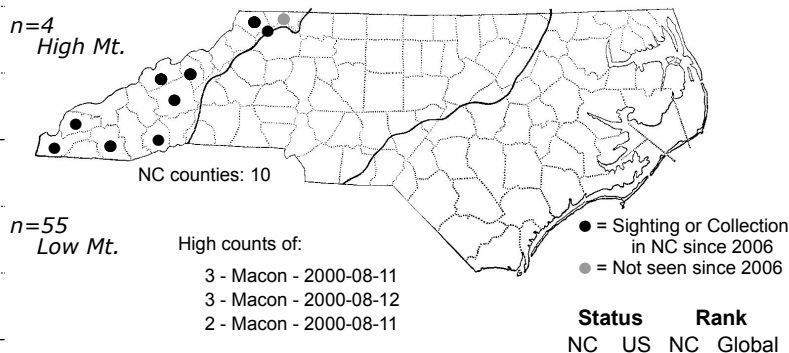
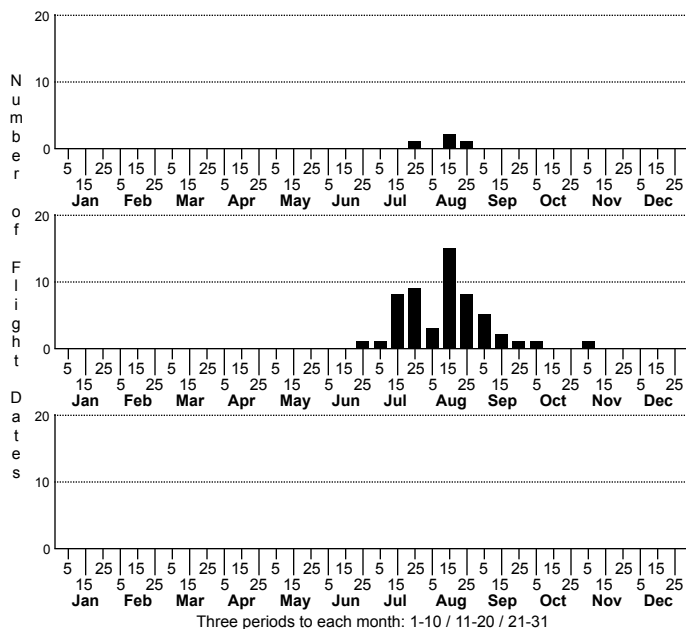

ID COMMENTS: This species is similar to *Xestia elimata* in its markings but has a darker gray ground color, which is often suffused with reddish (Lafontaine, 1998). The transverse lines can also be relatively obscure. It is also smaller and flies in the summer rather than the fall and early winter. For specimens observed in late summer, size is probably the most reliable way of distinguishing this species.

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on a wide range of conifers, including fir (*Abies*), larch (*Larix*), spruce (*Picea*), pine (*Pinus*), and hemlock (*Tsuga*) (Wagner et al., 2011).
