




Schinia lynx Lynx Flower Moth



FAMILY: Noctuidae SUBFAMILY: Heliothinae TRIBE:

TAXONOMIC COMMENTS: One of 126 species in this genus that occur in North America (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010, 2011), the majority of which occur in the West; 25 have been recorded in North Carolina.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: The majority of our records come from dry, open habitats, including sandhills and barrier island dunes. These habitats are much more consistent with the use of Camphorweed than Horseweed, which is a much weedier species.

FOOD: Reported hosts include Common Horseweed (*Erigeron canadensis*) and Camphorweed (*Heterotheca subaxillaris*) (Wagner et al., 2011).

STATE PROTECTION: Has no legal protection, although permits are required to collect it on state parks and other public lands.
