
Schinia nundina Goldenrod Flower Moth

TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: One of 126 species in this genus that occur in North America (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010, 2011), the majority of which occur in the West; 25 have been recorded in North Carolina.

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on goldenrods (<i>Solidago</i> spp.), including Canada Goldenrod (<i>S. canadensis</i>), Midwestern Stiff Goldenrod (<i>S. rigida</i>), and Northern Wand Goldenrod (<i>S. stricta</i>) (Wagner et al., 2011). They also reportedly feed on asters (Crumb, 1956), but we are unaware of any specific host records. In North Carolina, larvae have been found on goldenrods, including Showy Goldenrod (<i>S. speciosa</i>).
