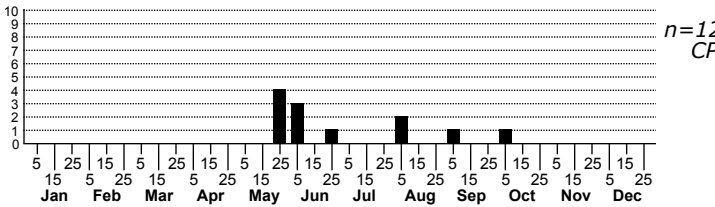
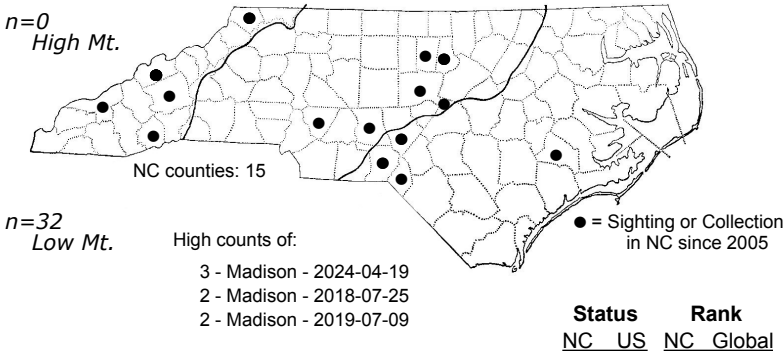
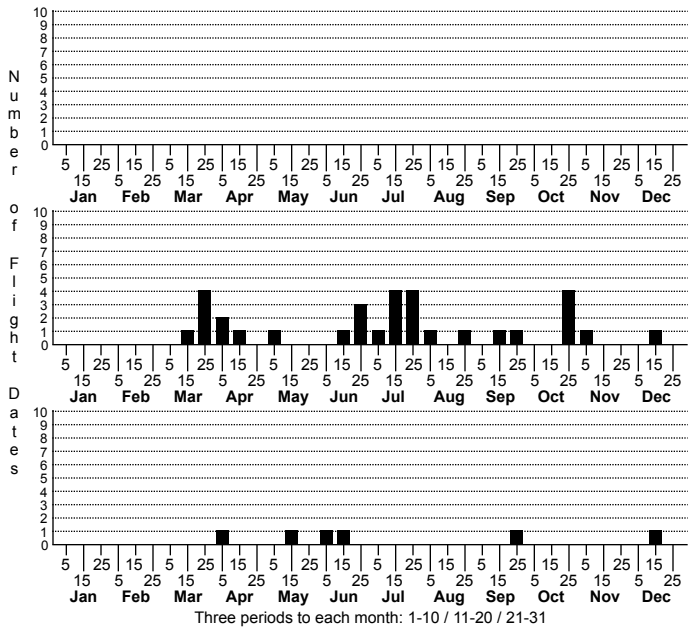

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae are leaf-rollers of several species of hardwood trees and shrubs, including birch (*Betula*), ironwood (*Ostrya*), chestnut (*Castanea*), hazel (*Corylus*), hickories (*Carya*), and oaks (*Quercus*) (Hodges, 1986). In North Carolina, we have reared a larva from a leaf-roll on hickory.
