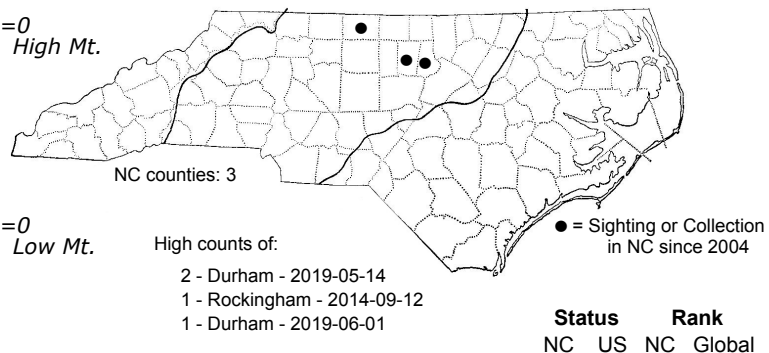
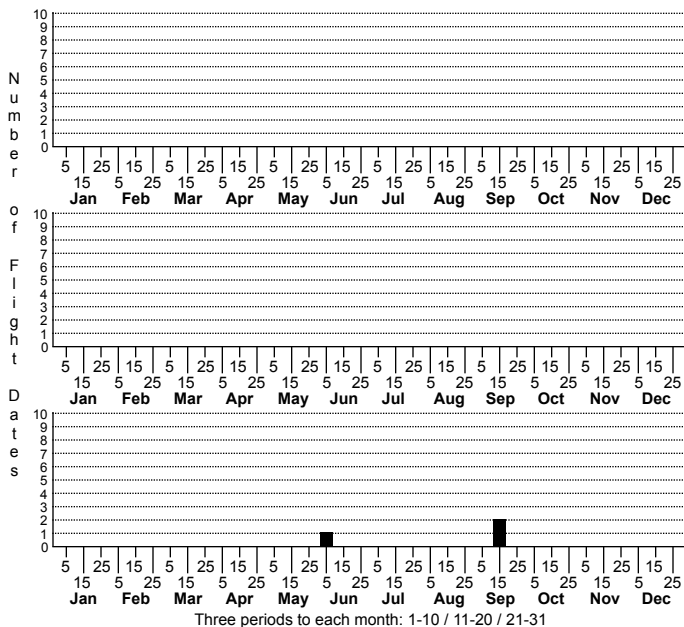

HABITAT:

FOOD: The larvae feed of several members of the Apiaceae, including Hairy-fruit Chervil (<i>Chaerophyllum tainturieri</i>), Canadian Honewort (<i>Cryptotaenia canadensis</i>), Yellow Pimpernel (<i>Taenidia integerrima</i>), Heartleaf Golden-Alexanders (<i>Zizia aptera</i>), Common Golden-Alexanders (<i>Z. aurea</i>; Eiseman 2019a). In North Carolina, mines have been recorded on Common Golden-Alexanders.
