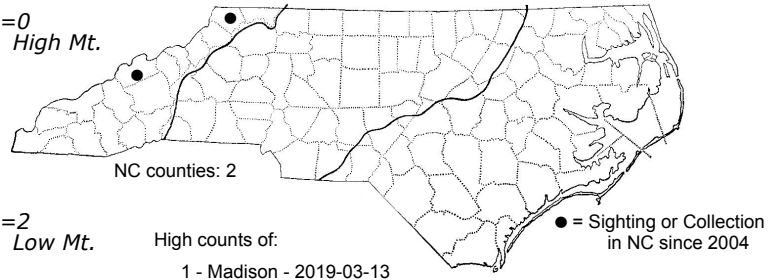
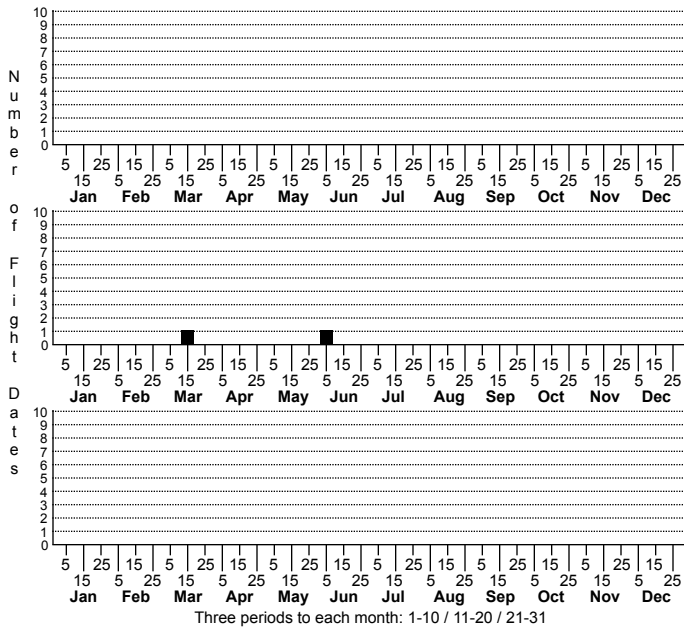
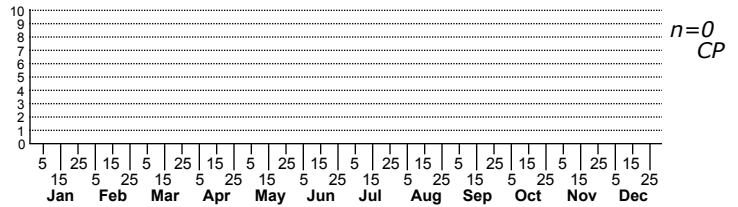

FOOD: Larvae feed on greenbriers (*Smilax* spp.). Landry (2007) reports Bristly Greenbrier (*S. hispida*) as a host plant, and BugGuide has a record for a larva on Common Greenbrier (*S. rotundifolia*). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
