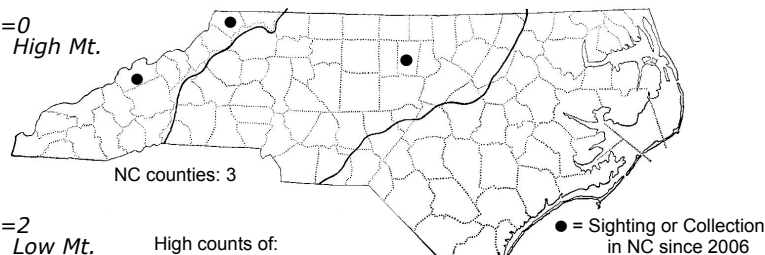
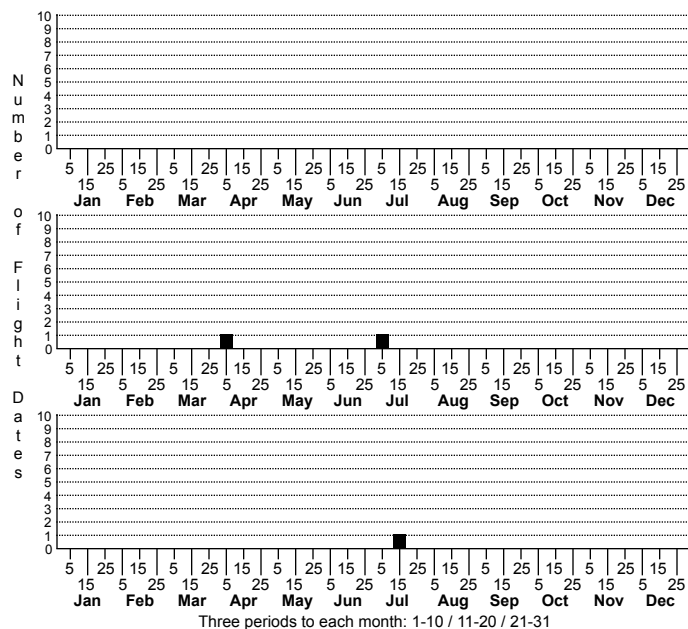
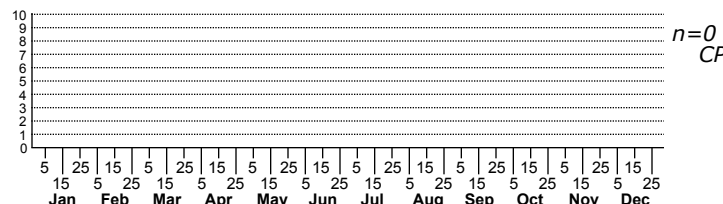

HABITAT:

FOOD: According to Royals et al. (2019), *P. rhoifructana* is the most polyphagous recorded species in the genus, feeding on plants in several families. Reported hosts include sumac (*Rhus*), Rattlesnake-master (*Eryngium yuccifolium*), Sweet Joe-pye-weed (*Eutrochium purpureum*), Common Elderberry (*Sambucus canadensis*), dogwood (*Cornus*), Sheep Laurel (*Kalmia angustifolia*), and Pink Azalea (*Rhododendron periclymenoides*). We have one feeding record in North Carolina from a blackberry (*Rubus*).
