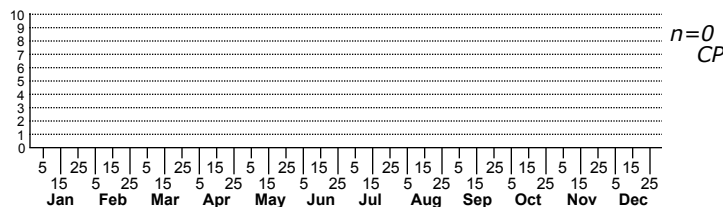
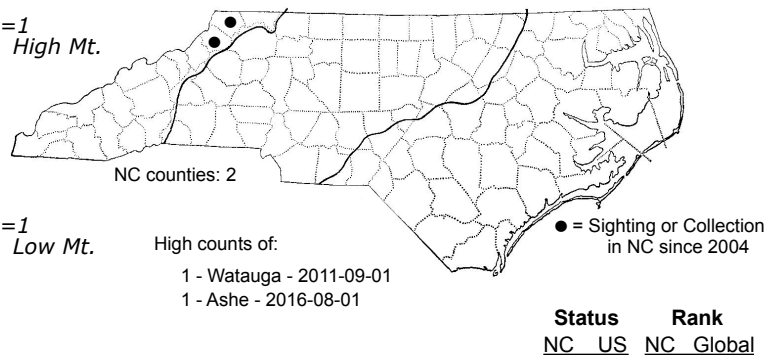
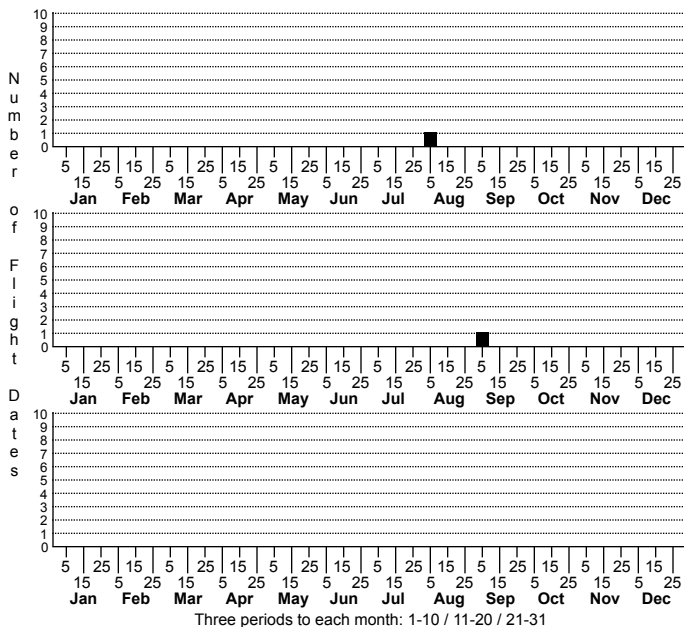

HABITAT:

FOOD: The larvae feed on poplars and willows (Freeman, 1957; Prentice, 1966; Miller, 1987; Beadle and Leckie, 2012). The reported hosts include Balsam Poplar (<i>Populus balsamifera</i>), Quaking Aspen (<i>P. tremuloides</i>) and willows (<i>Salix</i>).
