

FAMILY: Tortricidae SUBFAMILY: Tortricinae TRIBE: Cochylini TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: Specimens in North Carolina include individuals that conform to the original description of material from Florida, as well as a more boldly-marked form that has been found during the summer months. Both forms have similar genitalia and may simply reflect two seasonal color morphs of <i>Aethes triassumenta</i>. It is also possibly that they constitute two species.
