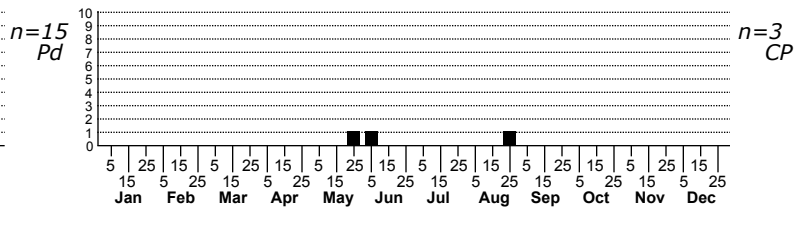
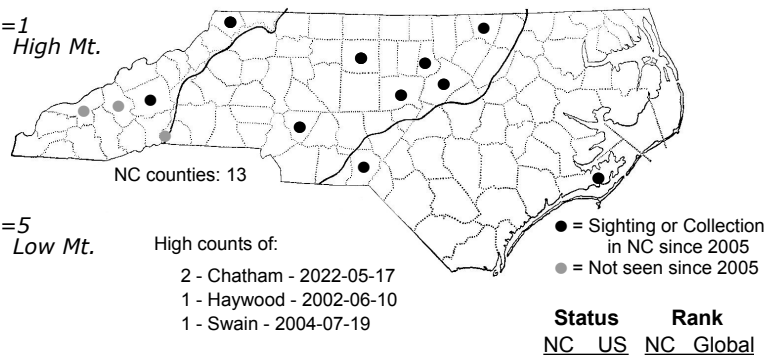
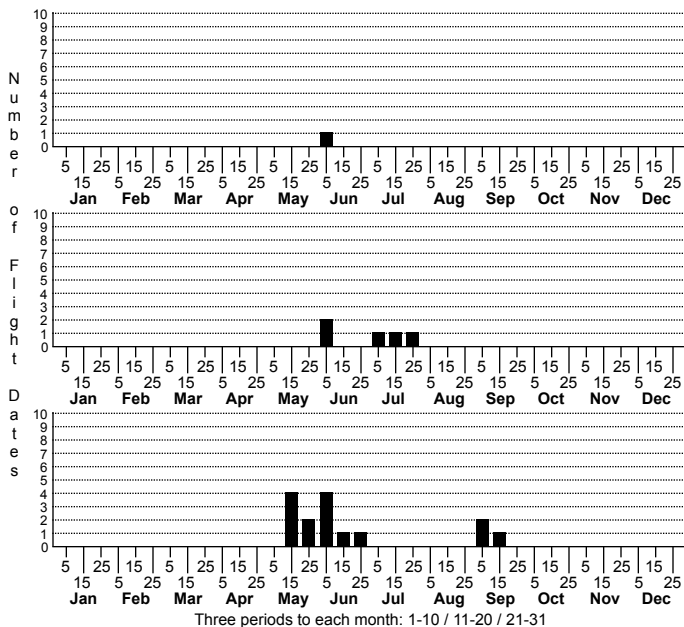


Hypsopygia intermedialis Red-shawled Moth

FOOD: Larvae reportedly feed on pine (<i>Pinus</i>) and spruce (<i>Picea</i>) (Robinson et al., 2010). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
