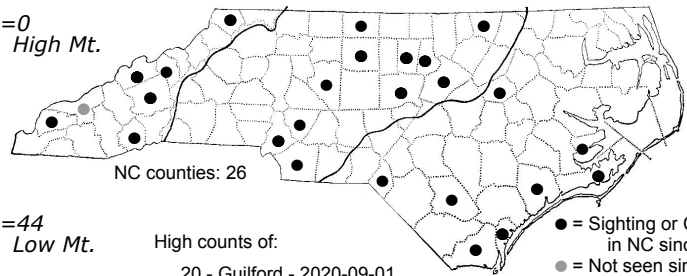
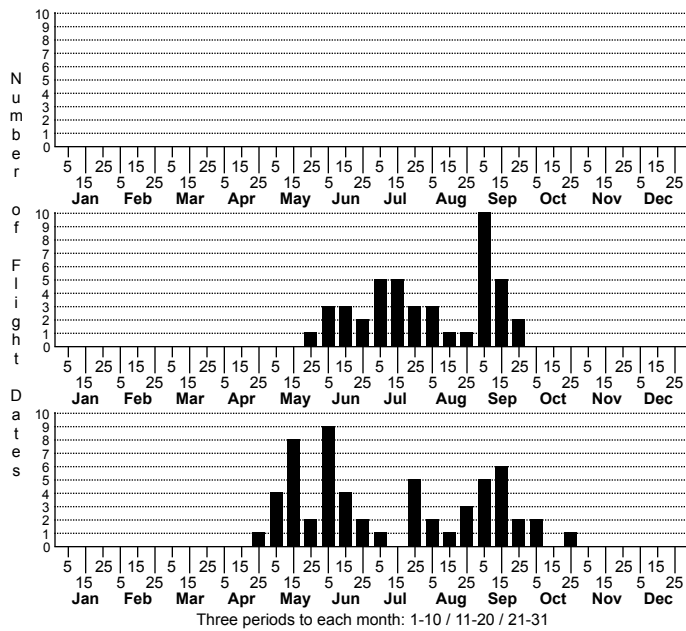
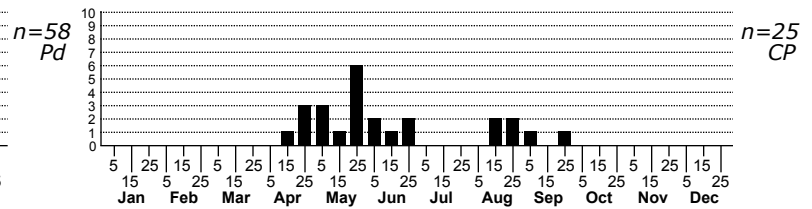


Hypsopygia binodulalis Pink-fringed Hypsopygia
