

HABITAT: The host plant occupies both wet forests and disturbed areas, including old fields and ruderal habitats. We have a number of records from pond and lake shorelines as well as from residential areas.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Trumpet Vine (Covell, 1984); also feeds on other members of the Bignoniaceae in Brazil (Robinson et al., 2010)
