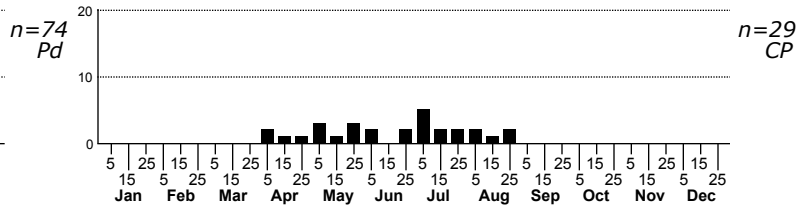
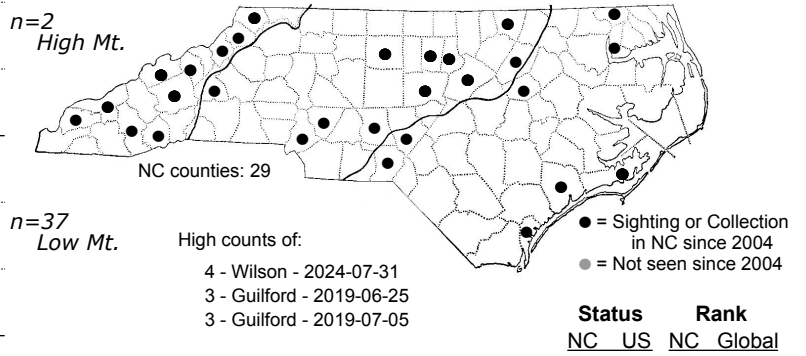
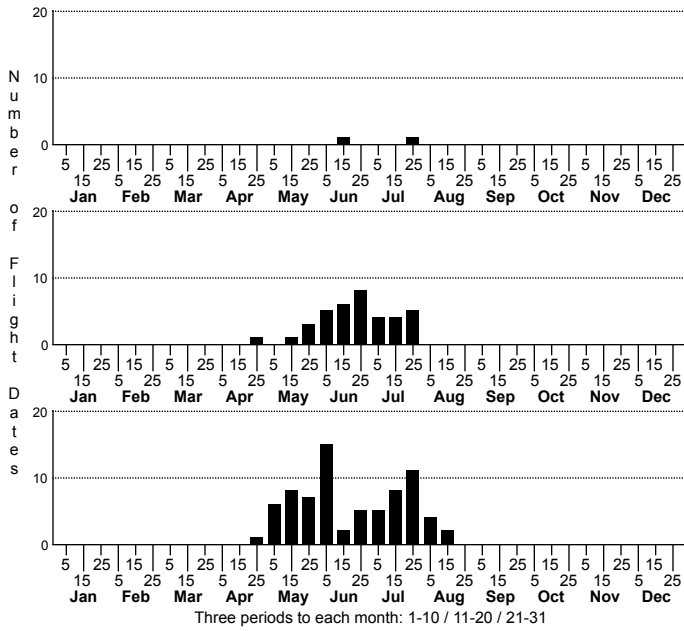

HABITAT: We have records from barrier islands, alluvial forests, cove forests, lakeshores, and residential areas

FOOD: Larvae feed on *Toxicodendron*, including Poison-ivy (*T. radicans*) and Poison Sumac (*T. vernix*) (Dyar, 1904). In North Carolina, it has been recorded on Poison-ivy.
