

HABITAT: Our two records for this species come from stands of bottomland hardwoods.

FOOD: In North Carolina, larvae have been recorded on Canada Moonseed (<i>Menispermum canadense</i>). Reports of this species on pawpaw (<i>Asimina</i>) or barberry (<i>Berberis</i>) may represent other species in this genus. There is also a BugGuide record (George Smiley, 2022) of a larva feeding on Carolina Coralbead (<i>Nephroia carolina</i>) in Texas.

OBSERVATION_METHODS: This species may come poorly to lights. Searching Moonseed populations for larvae may be the best way to document this species.
