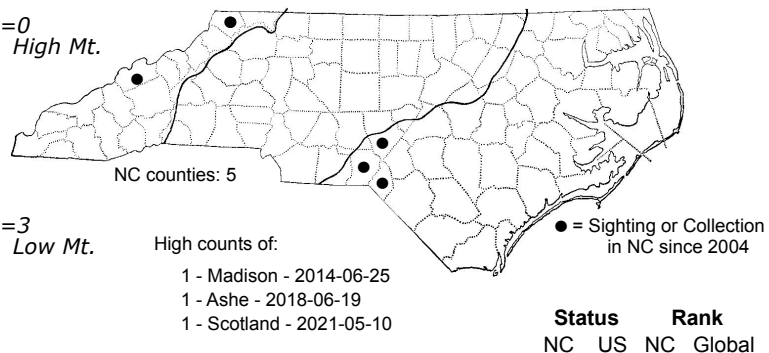
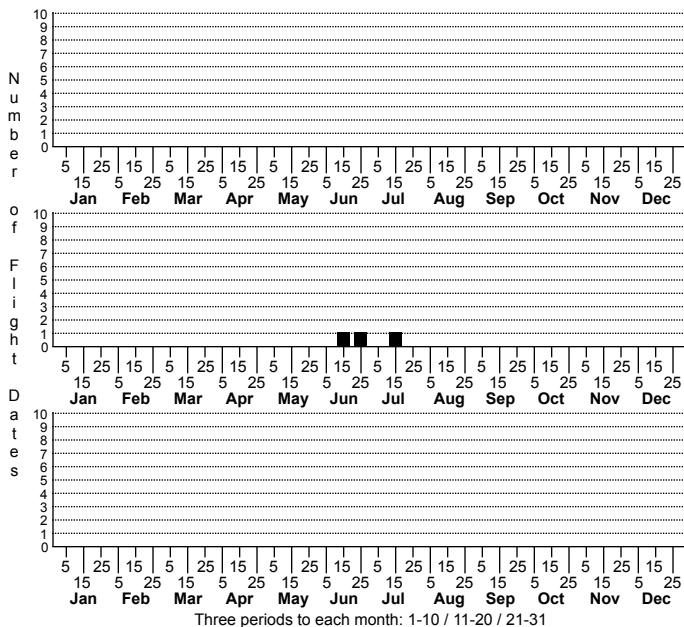
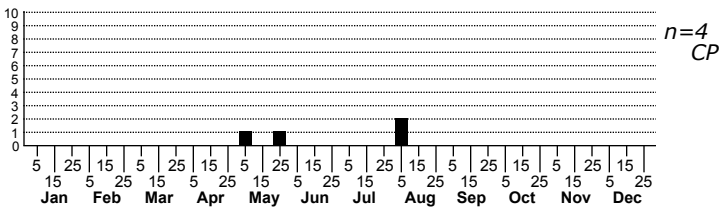

ID COMMENTS: "[<i>vaccinii</i> and <i>amplexella</i>] can be very close. Underside forewing can distinguish males, but females are generally by association" (Scholtens, 2017)

HABITAT: Our five records as of 2023 come from either fairly low elevations in the Blue Ridge or from the Sand Hills where <i>Kalmia</i> was likely growing in the vicinity.

FOOD: Larvae reportedly feed on <i>Kalmia</i> species (Heppner, 2003). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
