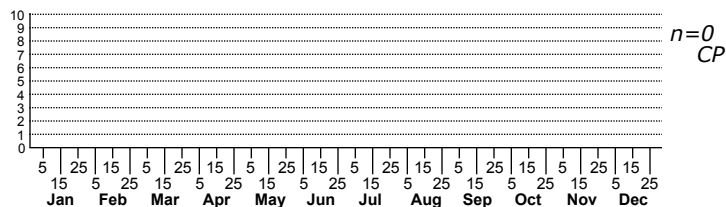
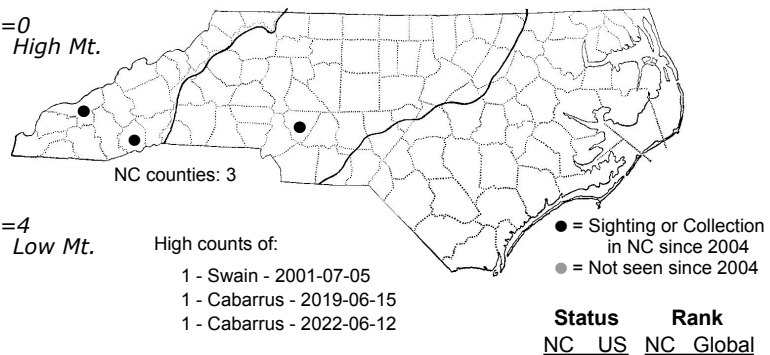
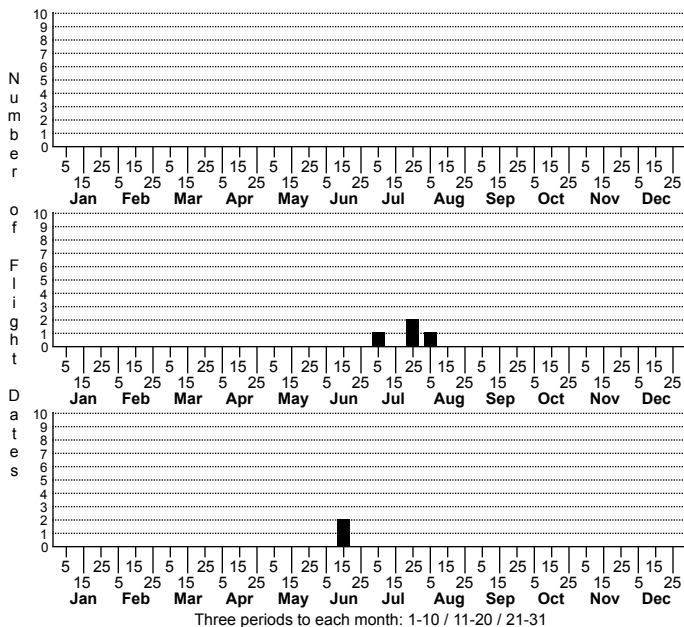

HABITAT: Our records currently come from just a few riparian sites. Given its recorded host plants, however, it probably occurs in both dry and mesic stands of oak-hickory forests.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Hickories, including Shagbark Hickory (<i>Carya ovata</i>), Mockernut Hickory (<i>C. tomentosa</i>), and Pignut Hickory (<i>C. glabra</i>) (Neunzig, 1972).
