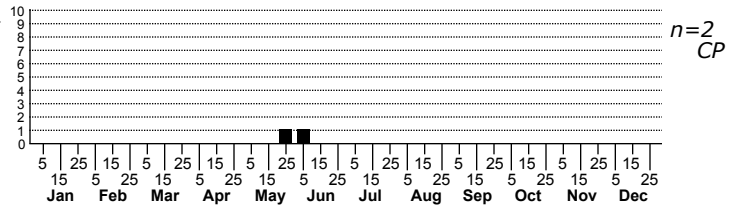
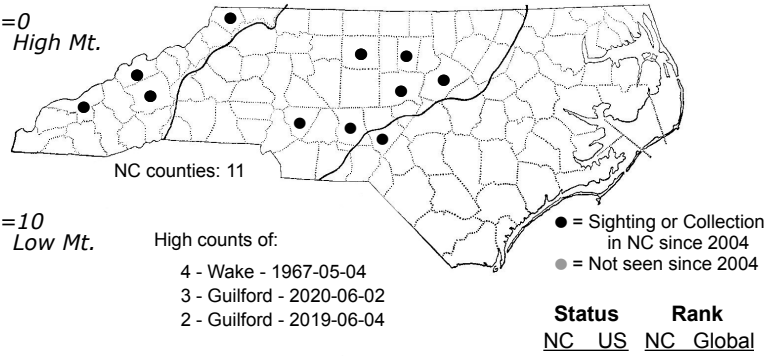
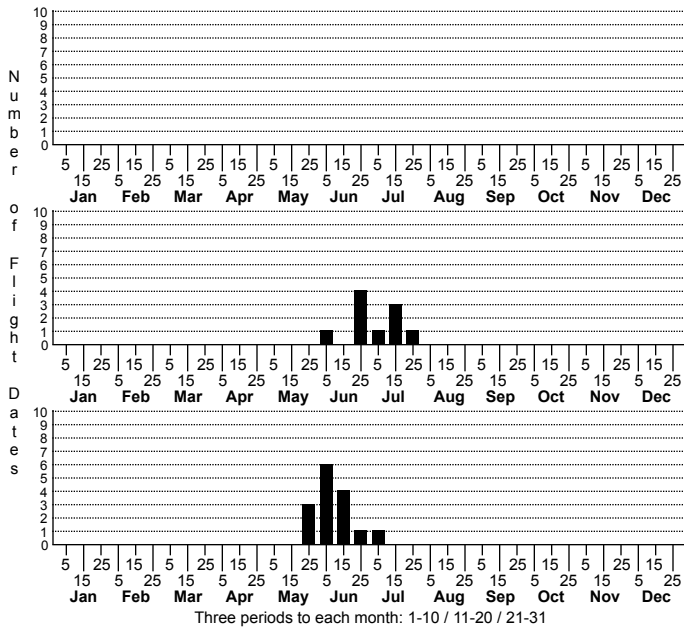

HABITAT: Our records come from stands of upland hardwoods. Based on the host plants recorded for this species, dry oak-hickory forests, basic-mesic forests, and rich bottomland forests may all be used.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Hickories, including Mockernut Hickory (<i>Carya tomentosa</i>), Pignut Hickory (<i>C. glabra</i>), Shagbark Hickory (<i>C. ovata</i>), and Bitternut Hickory (<i>C. cordiformis</i>) (Neunzig, 1972). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
