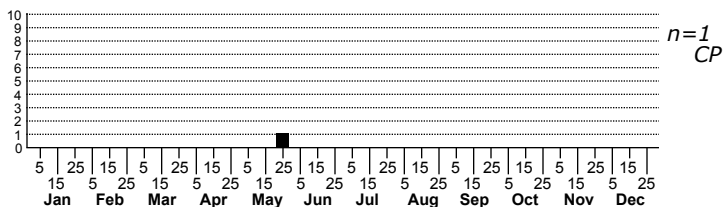
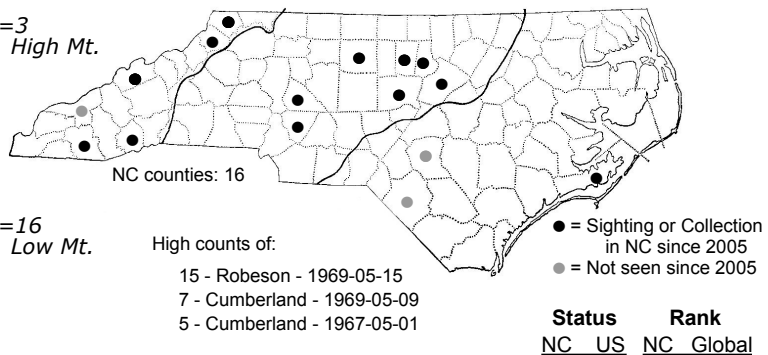
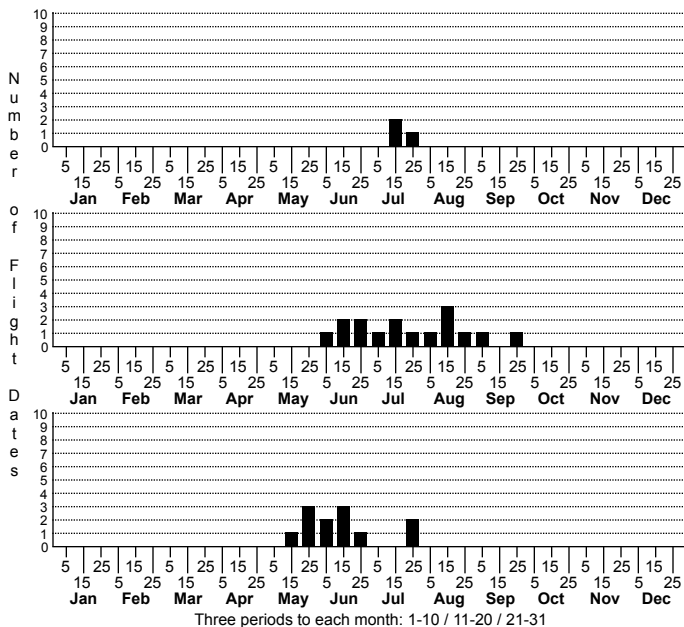

HABITAT: Based on the host plants used by this species, it probably mainly inhabits dry upland oak-hickory forests.

FOOD: Larvae feed on hickories, preferring Mockernut Hickory (<i>Carya tomentosa</i>) but also found on Pignut Hickory (<i>C. glabra</i>) and Sand Hickory (<i>C. pallida</i>) (Prentice, 1966; Neunzig, 1972).
