



HABITAT:

FOOD: The larvae feed on members of the Betulaceae and less commonly on members of the Myricaceae (Craighead et al., 1950; Schaffner, 1959; Neunzig, 1972; Prentice, 1966; Pohl et al., 2005; Robinson et al., 2010). The reported hosts include alders (<i>Alnus</i>), Yellow Birch (<i>Betula alleghaniensis</i>), Paper Birch (<i>B. papyrifera</i>), Gray Birch (<i>B. populifolia</i>), hazelnuts (<i>Corylus</i>) and sweet-gales (<i>Myrica</i>).
