



HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae are reported to feed on River Birch (<i>Betula nigra</i>) (Neunzig, 1975). River Birch is not typically found in Ashe County where this species has been collected, but a number had been planted near the collection site. It is also possible that another species of birch (such as <i>Betula alleghaniensis</i> or <i>B. lenta</i>) could be serving as a host in North Carolina.
