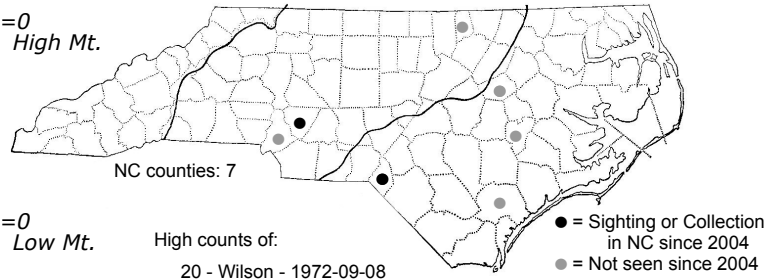
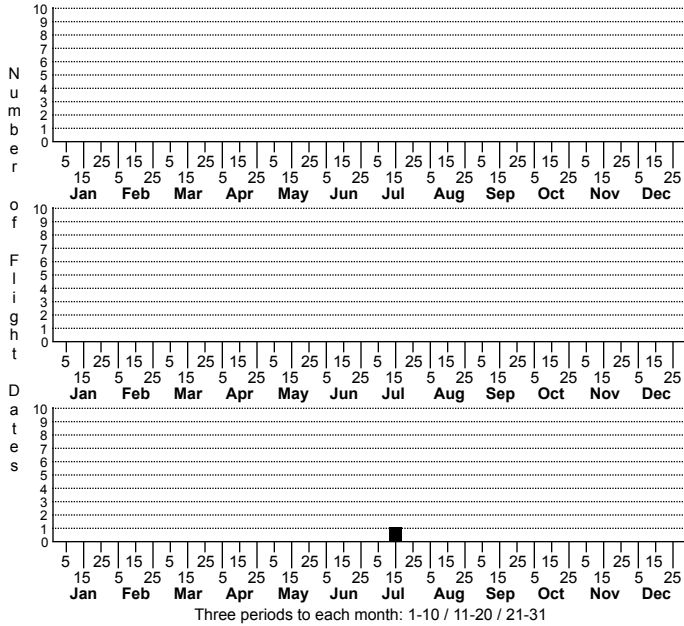
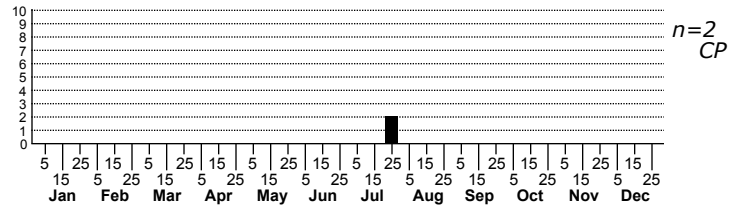


Monoptilota pergratialis Lima-bean Vine Borer Moth
