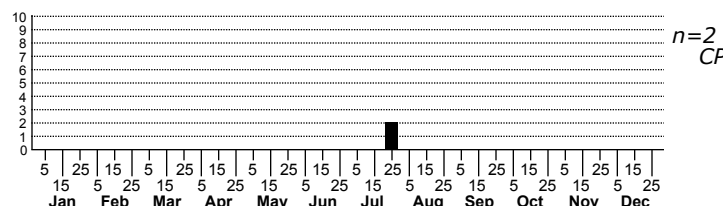
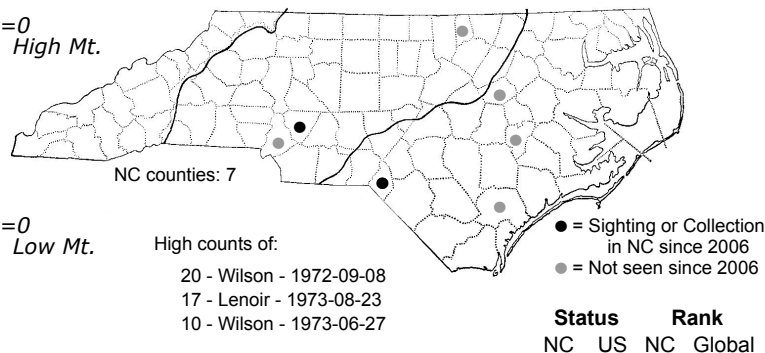
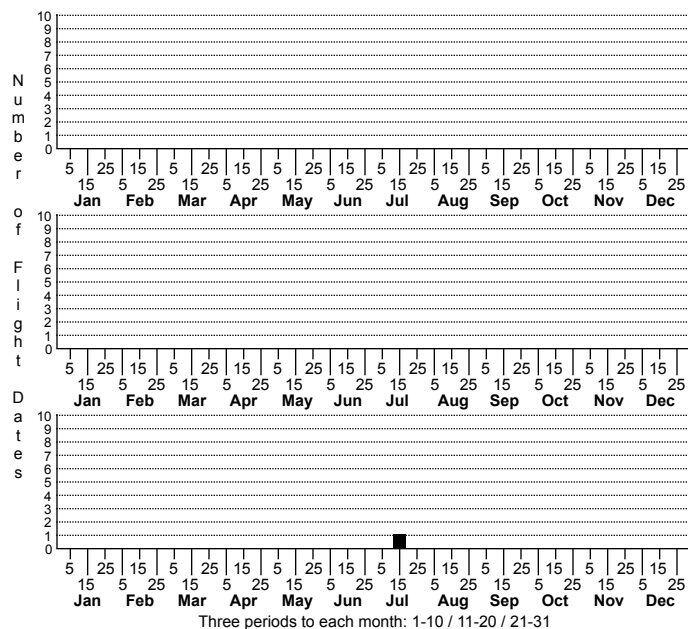


# *Monoptilota pergratialis* Lima-bean Vine Borer Moth

HABITAT: This species appears to occur only as a crop pest in North Carolina.

FOOD: Larvae may be monophagous on lima beans (<i>Phaseolus lunatus</i>), which appear to have originated in Central America (Neunzig, 1979).

STATE PROTECTION: Has no legal protection, although permits are required to collect it on state parks and other public lands.

COMMENTS: This species appears to be native to the Southwest and probably should be considered exotic in North Carolina.
