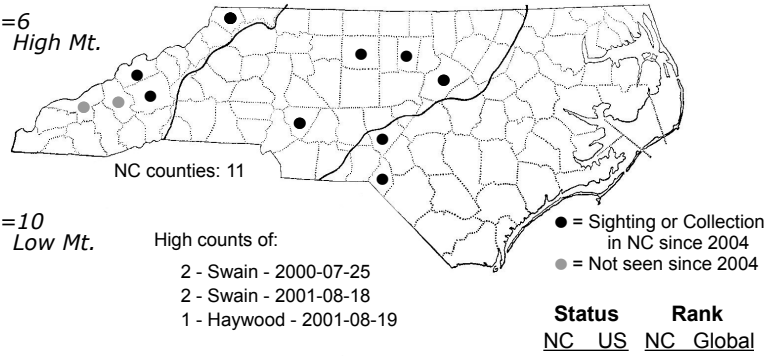
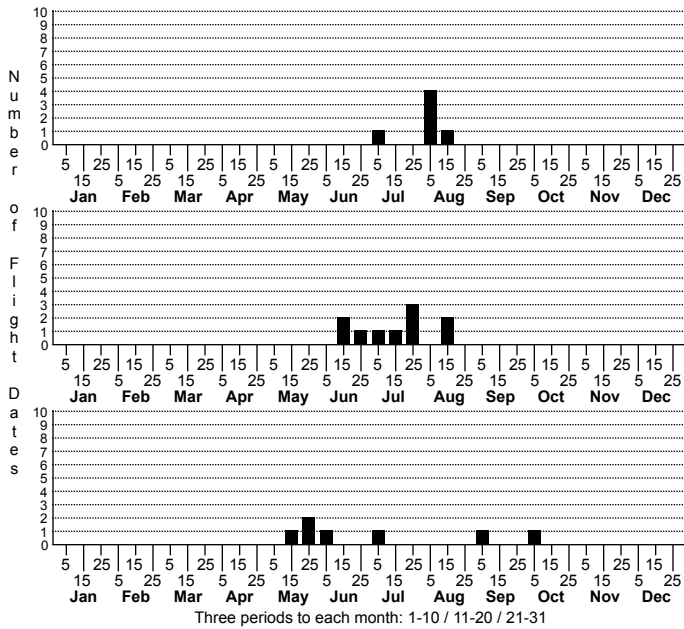


Oreana unicolorella Ladder-marked Caterpillar

HABITAT:

FOOD: The larvae are polyphagous and feed on a variety of hardwood trees and shrubs (Prentice, 1966; Robinson et al., 2010). The reported hosts include Red Maple (<i>Acer rubrum</i>), Yellow Birch (<i>Betula alleghaniensis</i>), hawthorns (<i>Crataegus</i>), Common Apple (<i>Malus domestica</i>), White Oak (<i>Quercus alba</i>), Northern Red Oak (<i>Q. rubra</i>), willows (<i>Salix</i>), American Basswood (<i>Tilia americana</i>) and American Elm (<i>Ulmus americana</i>).
