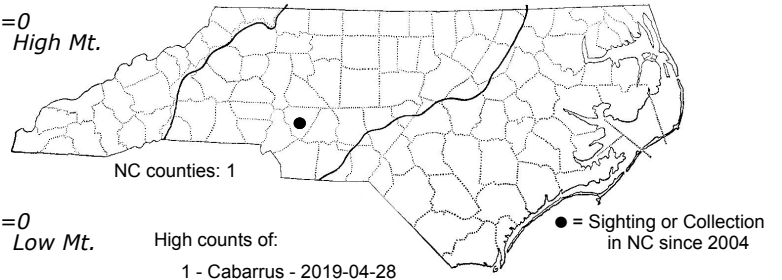
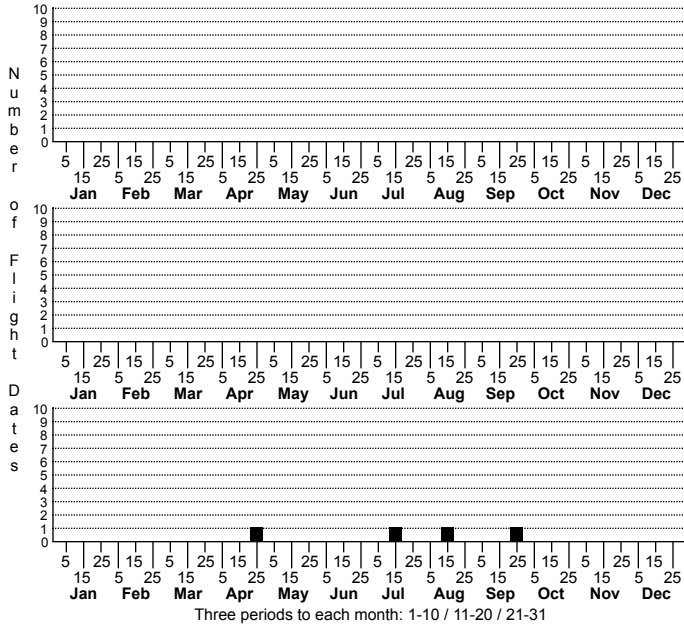
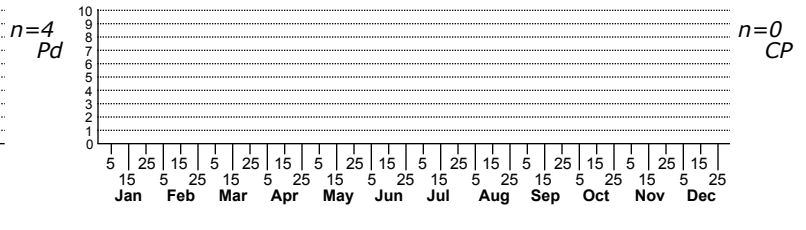

HABITAT: Our sole records for this species come from a watershed where cottonwoods are abundant and where we have records for other cottonwood specialists, such as the Big Poplar Sphinx.

FOOD: According to Heinrich (1956) and Neunzig (2003), Eastern Cottonwood is probably the only host plant for this species. Records from Lycopus and Amorpha are probably in error.
