



FOOD: The hosts are poorly documented. American Basswood (<i>Tilia americana</i>) is reported as a commonly used host (Prentice, 1966), but Heppner (2007) lists this species as using false-indigo (<i>Amorpha</i>). Research is needed to determine the hosts used in North Carolina.
