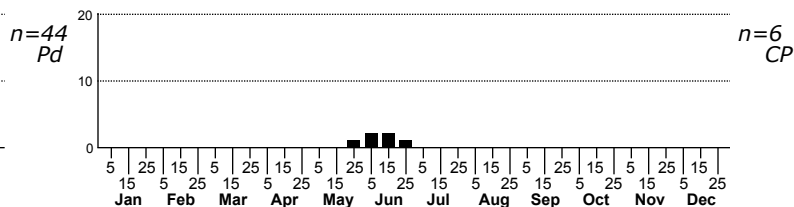
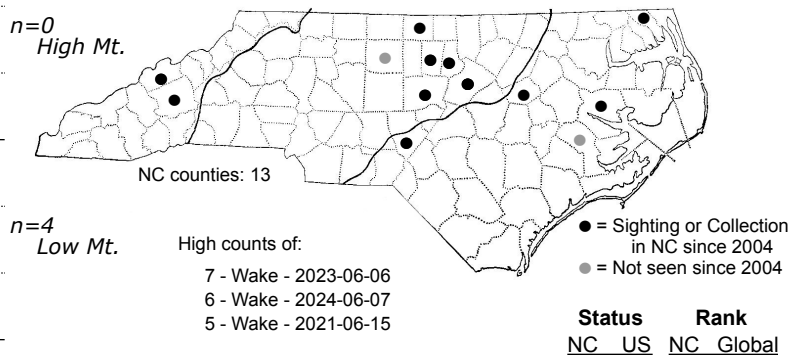
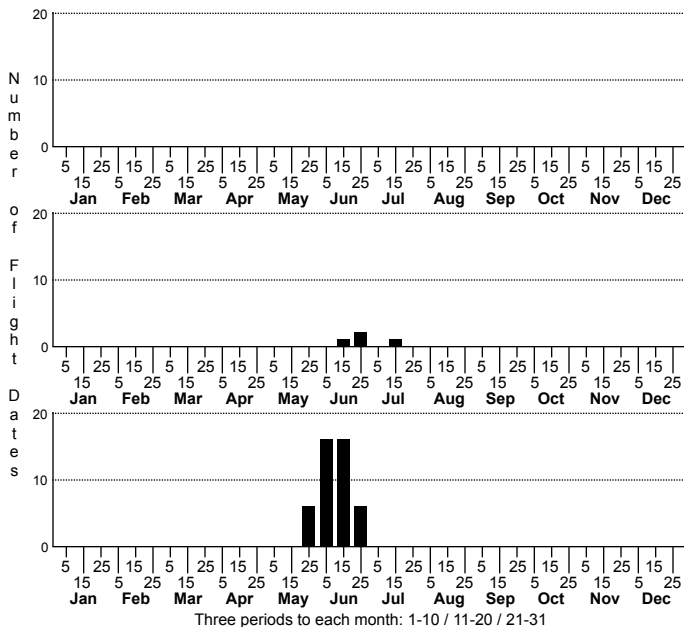


Dioryctria disclusa Webbing Coneworm Moth

HABITAT:

FOOD: The larvae feed on both northern and southern pines (Baker, 1972; Prentice, 1966; Robinson et al., 2010). The reported hosts include Jack Pine (<i>Pinus banksiana</i>), Mugo Pine (<i>P. mugo</i>), Longleaf Pine (<i>P. palustris</i>), Red Pine (<i>P. resinosa</i>), Pitch Pine (<i>P. rigida</i>), Scotch Pine (<i>P. sylvestris</i>), Loblolly Pine (<i>P. taeda</i>), and Virginia Pine (<i>P. virginiana</i>).
