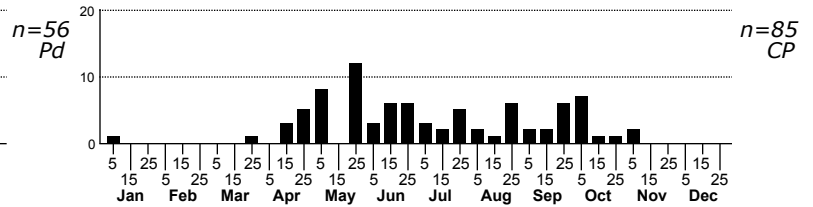
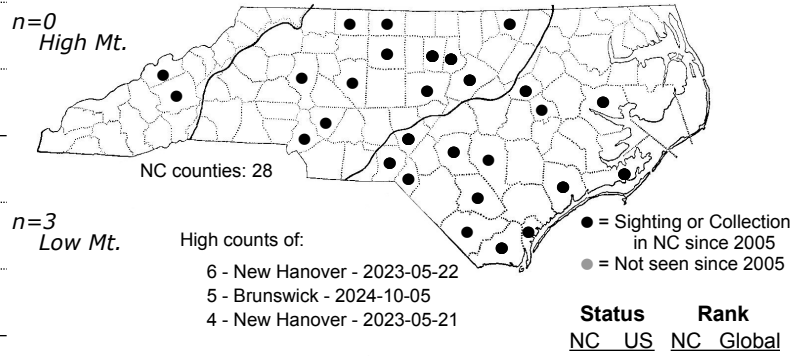
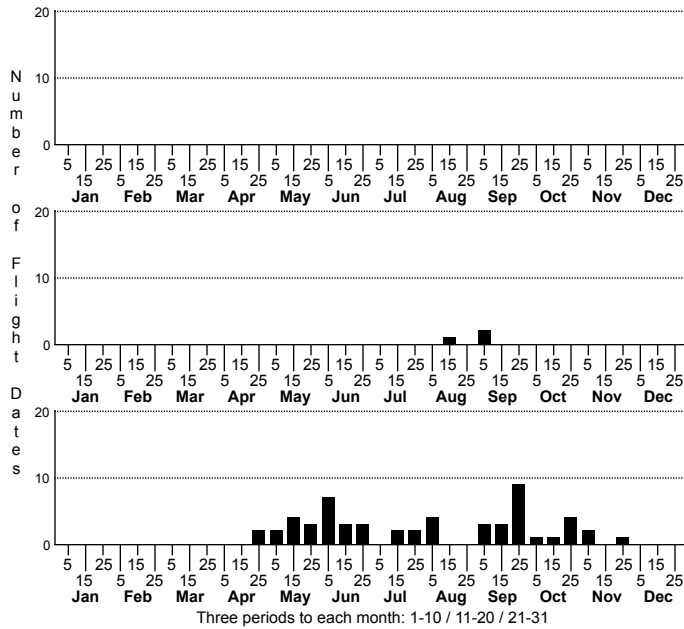

FOOD: Larvae feed on various pines. Reported hosts include Shortleaf Pine (<i>P. echinata</i>), Longleaf Pine (<i>P. palustris</i>), Pond Pine (<i>P. serotina</i>), Loblolly Pine (<i>P. taeda</i>), and Virginia Pine (<i>P. virginiana</i>) (Baker, 1972; Meeker, 2004).
