The antemedian and postmedian areas largely shaded with dull red but in this species, the outer portion of the median area, and often the inner area as well, is black, dusted with white (Forbes, 1923). <i>Euzophera ostricolorella</i> is much larger and the outer portion of the median area is fuscous rather than black and is broadly shaded with strawberry red.
