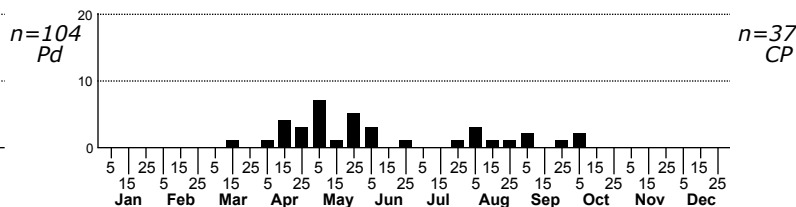
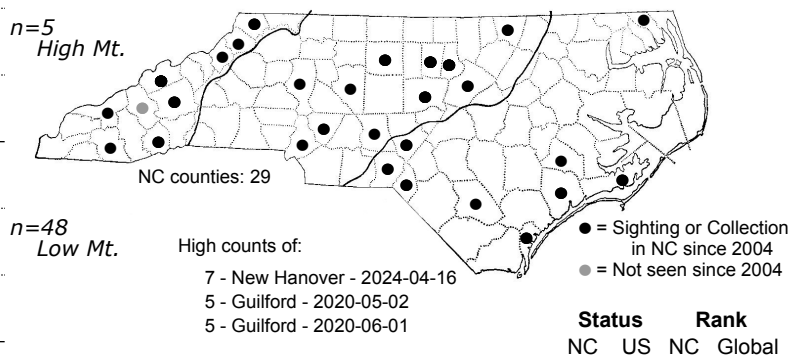
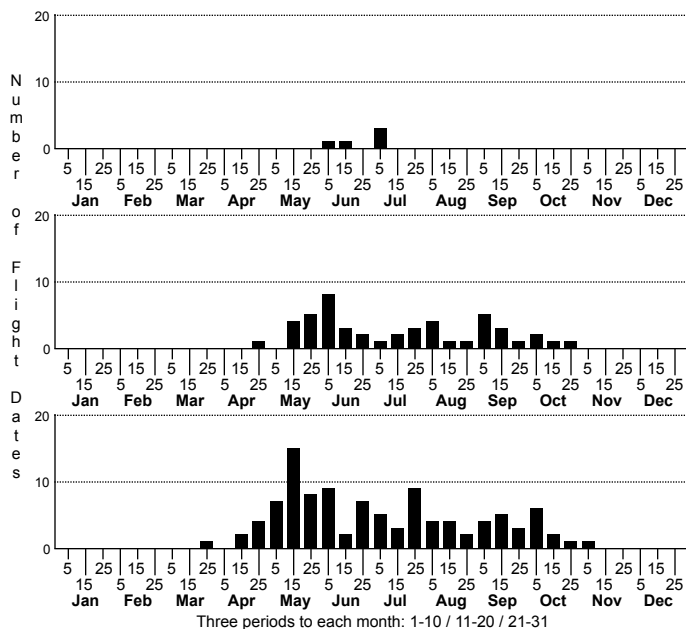


Eulogia ochrifrontella Broad-banded Eulogia Moth

HABITAT: Many of our records come from residential neighborhoods. Records from natural areas commonly come from wet or mesic hardwoods, but with some from xeric habitats.

FOOD: Larval hosts include hardwood trees, including Pecan, Apple, and Oak (Heinrich, 1956). Neunzig (1990) noted that these records were based on specimen labels, with no information provided for the basis for the record.
