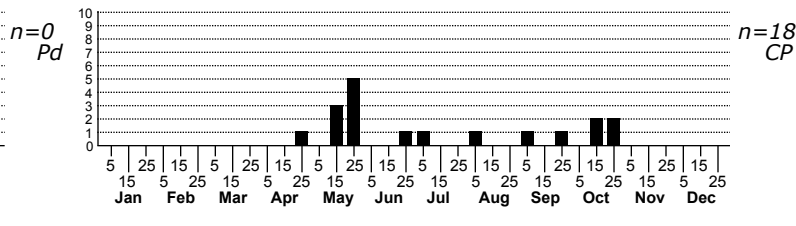
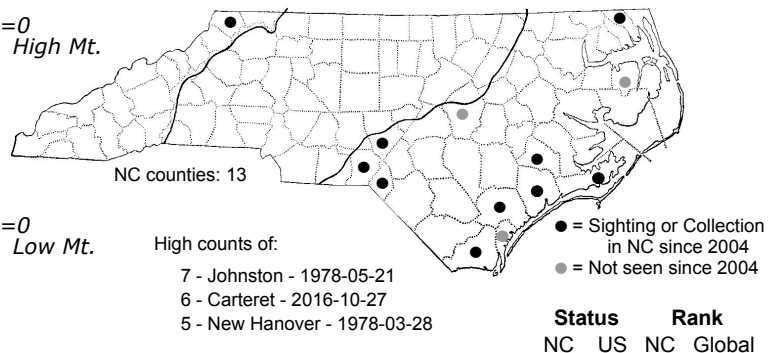


Caudellia apyrella Crescent-winged Caudellia Moth

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on the seeds of Dodder (<i>Cuscuta</i> species); <i>Cuscuta compacta</i> and <i>C. gronovii</i> have both been documented as hosts in North Carolina (Corrette and Neunzig, 1979). Both of those species inhabit wetlands, including bottomland forests and open, herb-dominated habitats.
