

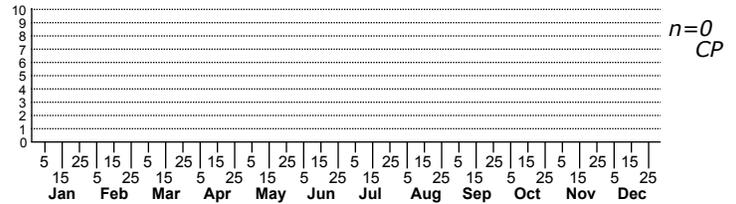


Amblyptilia pica Geranium Plume Moth
