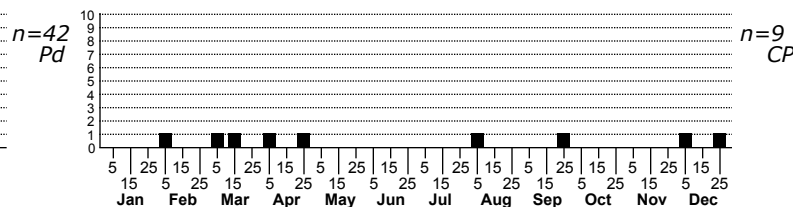
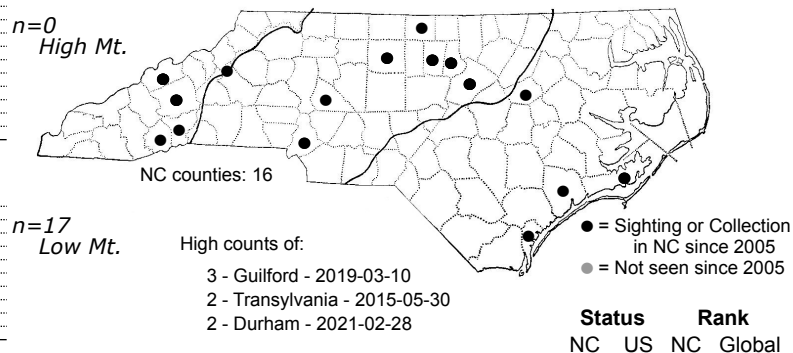
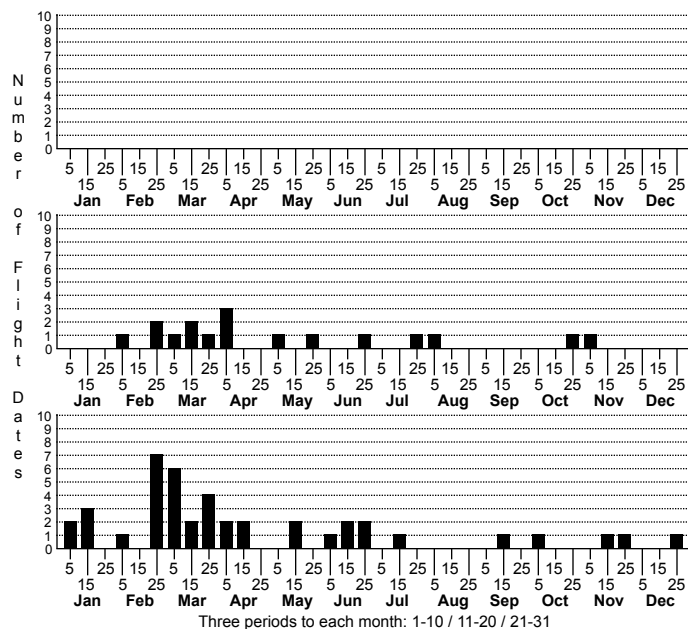


Emmelinea monodactyla Morning-glory Plume Moth

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on many herbaceous species in the families Chenopodiaceae, Convolvulaceae, and others (Robinson et al., 2010). Among the reported hosts are orach (*Atriplex*), Lamb's-quarters (*Chenopodium album*), bindweed (*Convolvulus*), joe-pye-weed (*Eutrochium*), and morning-glory (*Ipomoea*) (Schaffner, 1959; Matthews et al., 1990; Heppner, 2007). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
