




Pseudothyatira cymatophoroides Tufted Thyatirid

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on American Hornbeam (*Carpinus caroliniana*), birch (*Betula*), blackberry (*Rubus*), serviceberry (*Amelanchier*), and probably many other woody plants (Wagner, 2005). In North Carolina, our only feeding records as of 2025 are from blackberry and Northern Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*).
