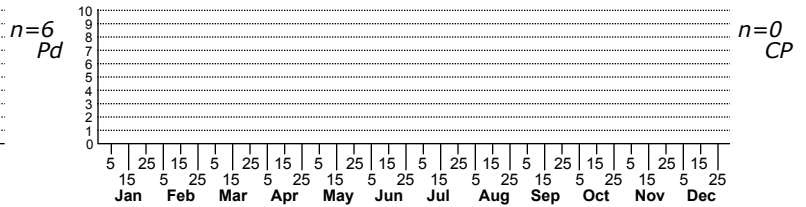
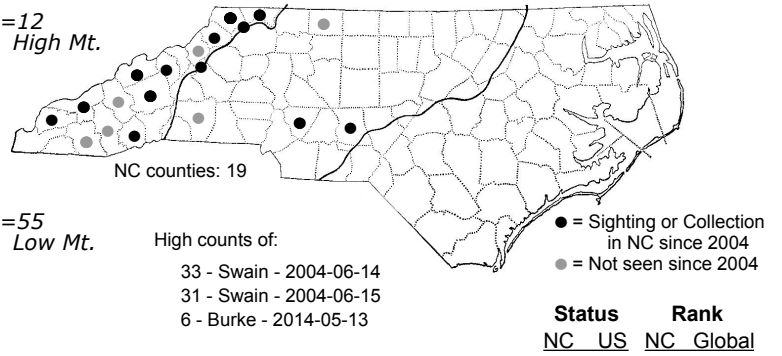
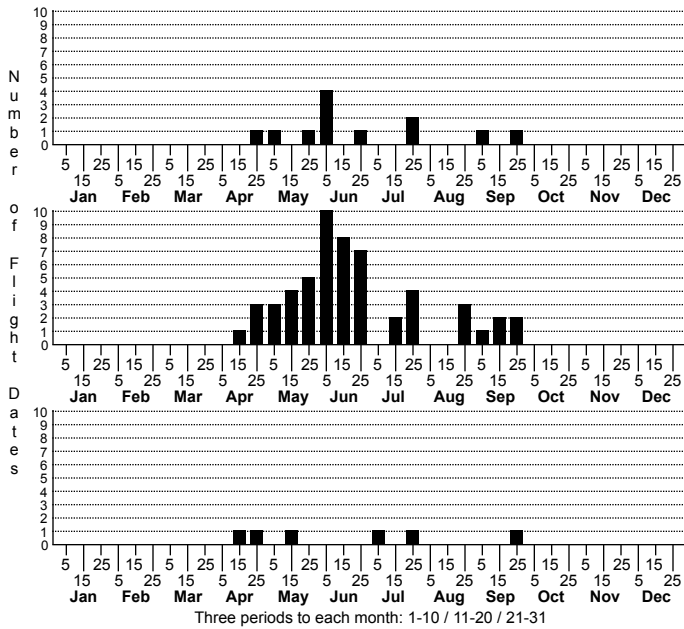


Aethalura intertexta Four-Barred Gray Moth
