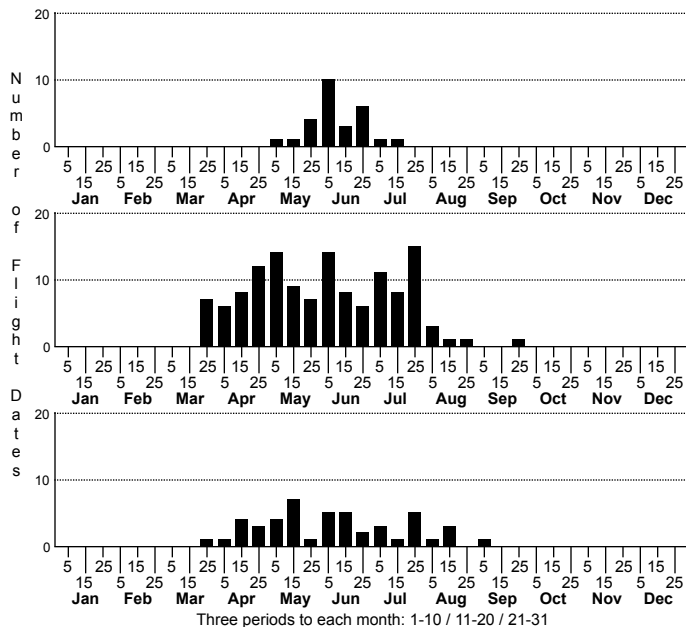


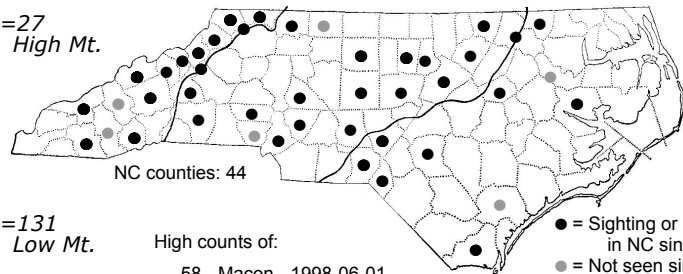
Lomographa vestaliata White Spring Moth

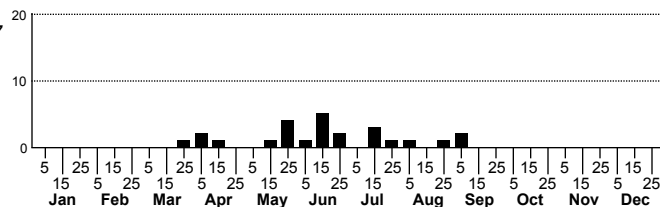

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on a variety of woody species in the Rosaceae, with other hardwoods listed possibly in error (Wagner, 2005); reported hosts include hawthorn (*Crataegus*), apple (*Malus*), Common Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius*), cherry (*Prunus*), and American Mountain-ash (*Sorbus americana*). In North Carolina, a larva has been recorded feeding on Chickasaw Plum (*Prunus angustifolia*).
