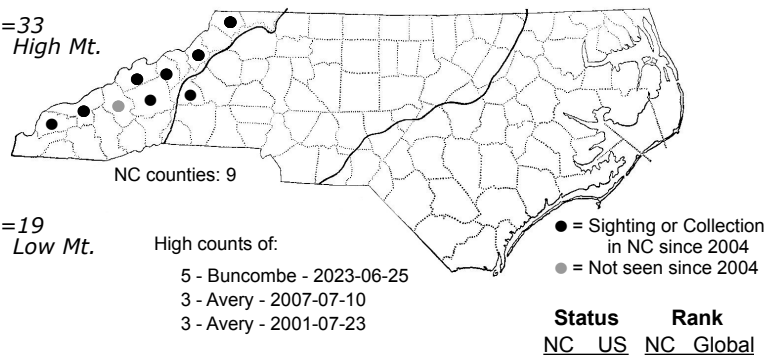
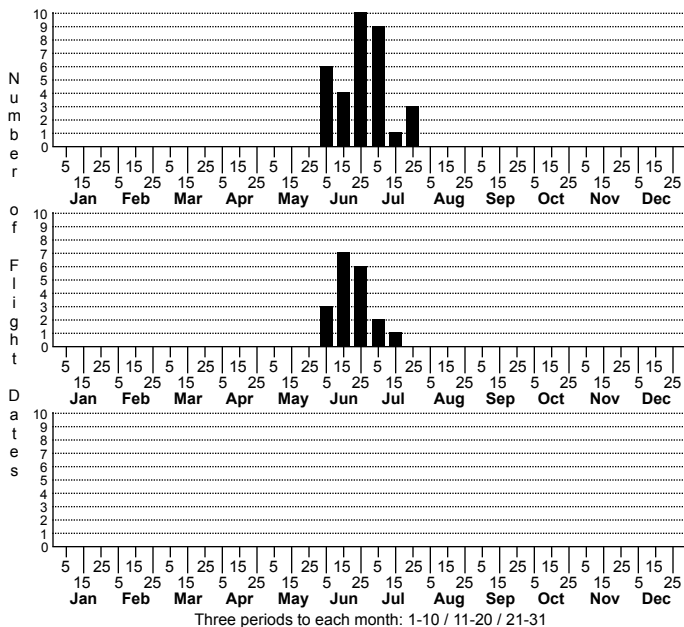


*Euchlaena tigrinaria* Mottled Euchlaena

HABITAT: North Carolina records come from montane forests, including hardwoods and Spruce-Fir.

FOOD: Polyphagous, larval hosts include birch, hazelnut, oak, poplar, serviceberry, willow, and probably many other hardwood trees and shrubs; pine is also included (Wagner et al., 2001).
