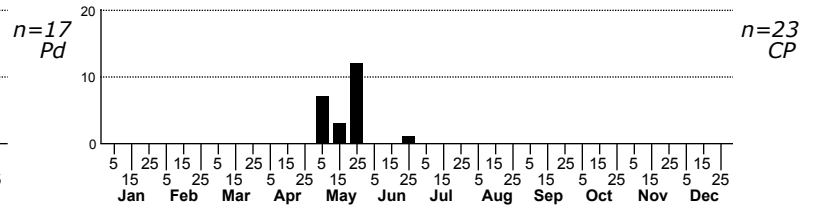
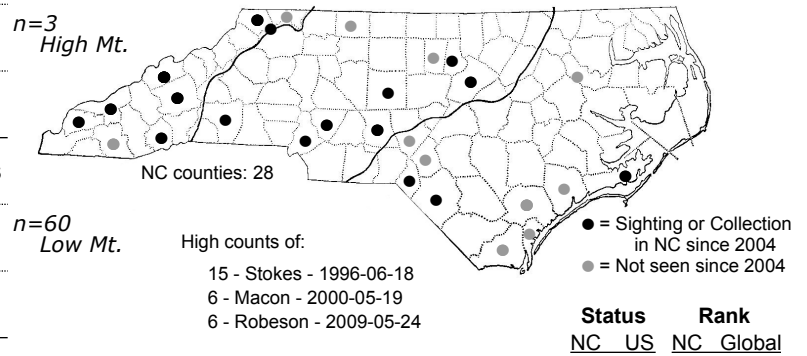
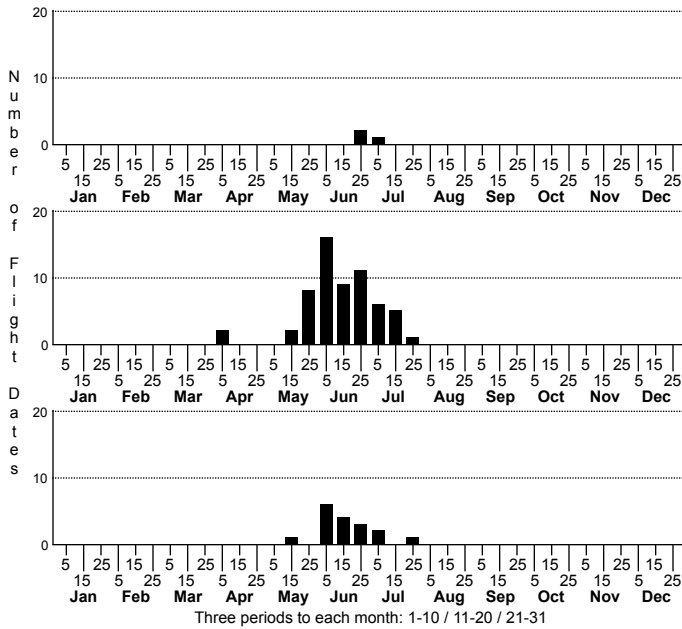


Metarranthis angularia Angled Metarranthis Moth
