
Metarranthis indeclinata Pale Metarranthis

ID COMMENTS: Similar to refractaria but indeclilnata but refractaria is slightly larger and the pm line is usually a good indicator. It comes to a real point where the angle breaks and the line up to the costa is longer. All in all it is a more tailored species with all the markings crisper (JBS, pers. obs.)

HABITAT:

FOOD: Ferguson (1975) reported larvae feeding on Choke Cherry (<i>Prunus virginiana</i>), and there is a BugGuide record (Gouvernement du Québec) of a larva reared from Sugar Maple (<i>Acer saccharum</i>). Other reported hosts require verification.
