




# *Cepphis decoloraria* Dark Scallop Moth

HABITAT: The majority of our records come from bottomlands, swamp forests, and bogs. Even our sandhill records come from streamhead forests and we have none from dry or open habitats.

FOOD: Larvae feed on birch (*Betula*), blackberry (*Rubus*), cherry (*Prunus*), and probably other species of hardwood trees and shrubs (Wagner et al., 2001). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
