




Probole amicaria Friendly Probole

HABITAT: Forests, woodlands, shrubby fields, and wetlands (Wagner et al., 2001). Our records come from a wide range of hardwood-dominated habitats, with few coming from Longleaf Pine habitats or peatlands.

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on a wide range of hardwood trees and shrubs; also reported on spruce (Wagner et al., 2001). Specific hosts include maple (<i>Acer</i>), alder (<i>Alnus</i>), serviceberry (<i>Amelanchier</i>), Flowering Dogwood (<i>Benthamidia florida</i>), birch (<i>Betula</i>), American Hornbeam (<i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>), beech (<i>Fagus</i>), willow (<i>Salix</i>), American Basswood (<i>Tilia americana</i>), and elm (<i>Ulmus</i>). In North Carolina, J. B. Sullivan reared a larva from an unidentified dogwood.
