



Plagodis serinaria Lemon Plagodis

HABITAT: Forests and woodlands (Wagner et al., 2001). Our records come from high elevation hardwood forest, cove forests, and montane riparian forests.

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on many hardwood trees including basswood (<i>Tilia</i>), beech (<i>Fagus</i>), birch (<i>Betula</i>), maple (<i>Acer</i>), oak (<i>Quercus</i>), and poplar (<i>Populus</i>) (Wagner et al., 2001).
