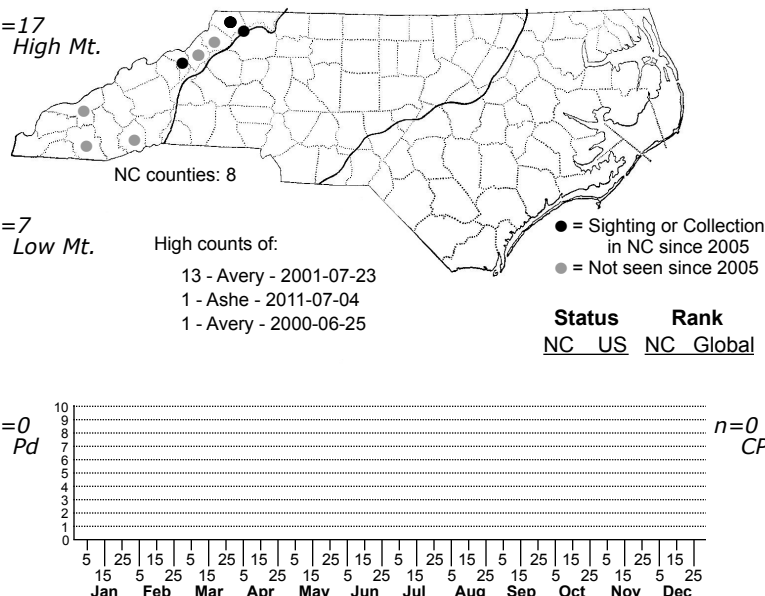
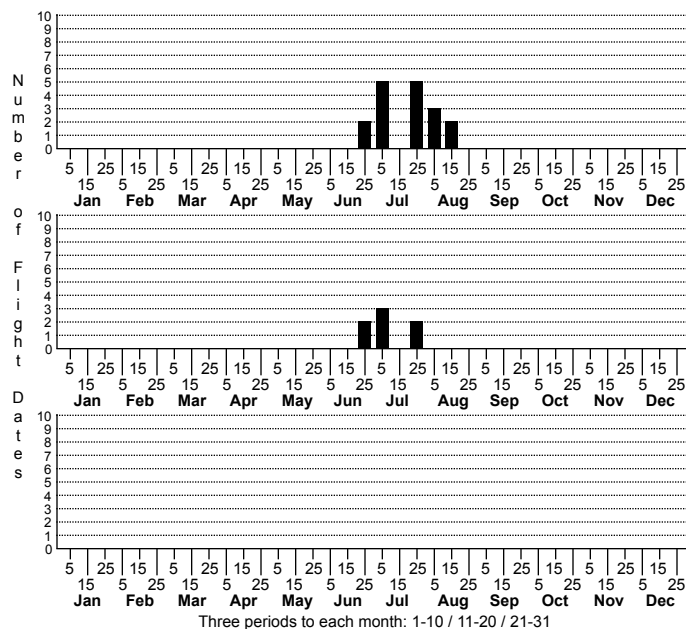


Eulithis explanata White Eulithis

HABITAT: Bogs, barrens, heathy woodlands, and forests (Wagner et al., 2001). Our records come mainly from high elevation forests, including northern hardwood and spruce-fir communities. A few also come from bogs and lakeshore habitats.

FOOD: Larvae reportedly feed on blueberries (<i>Vaccinium</i> spp.) (Wagner et al., 2001). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
